Speaker Notes and News

Douglas Pulley, MD, will be presenting a talk entitled, "How to Make Catts Obey."

Dr. Pulley has been raising orchids for over 31+ years now. It all started when his wife gave him a cattleya for his birthday on April 1st, 1974, and he gave her another three weeks later. Because of the Armacost & Royston moving sale, he had over 100 orchids by that August.

He moved to Los Gatos in 1976 and put up his greenhouse. He received his first AM/AOS award in 1979 on an Angraecum, a seedling purchased for \$5 from the A&R sale. Soon he started breeding. His over 200 orchid hybrids include Cattleya, Miltonia, Dendrobium, Angraecum, Paphiopedilum, Phragmipedium, Cymbidium, and Stanhopea. He is the world's biggest breeder of Stanhopeas, having made half of all hybrids ever registered. His plants have won over 25 AOS awards. He has spoken at seven societies in northern California, including San Francisco. He has been President and Vice President of the Santa Clara Valley Orchid Society a total of seven years. Professionally he is an Ophthalmologist.

He welcomes visitors to his greenhouse in Los Gatos (by appointment only.) Please call 408/399-3123 and he will get back to you.

Dr. Pulley will provide the plant table, which will feature Cattleyas, Laelia, Phrags, pendulous Cyms, regular Cyms, Coelogyne, Stanhopeas, Dendrobium, Florida Ghost Orchid, Sievekingia, and probably others.

For the skill session this month, we will have a presentation by Jim Griffin on potting. Beginning at 7 p.m. on March 1 he will lead a discussion of "Potting by Objective." Every orchid grows and blooms best in a pot/root environment that meets its unique needs. Learn to create potting environments that enable each of your orchids to bloom best.

The SCVOS Annual Show and Sale is coming up at the end of March!! As you you're your schedules for the upcoming month, remember there are four ways you can contribute to the success of the show:

1. **Bring plants** to the show. You can bring one, or you can bring a whole exhibit. Show & Tell is one of the best parts of the monthly meetings; think about the show as a big "Show & Tell." The more plants that are entered, the more people will enjoy the show. Remember that you may put in an exhibit individually or with a friend or two; exhibits are wonderful ways to display your creativity!
2. **Sell plants** at the show. Also, buy plants at the show. Your sales plants and your purchases help support the various functions of our society, including our wonderful monthly programs, the raffle, and our show itself. As an added bonus for this year, you can **actually request plants for the society to buy for you!!** All you need to do is fill out a space on the board passed around at the meetings. Heck, you can even just [email me](#) with your requests!!
3. **Volunteer your time** at the show. The show is completely volunteer-run, and we need lots of help!! You can find out how and where to help out on the show schedule at the end of the newsletter. Please volunteer early and often; you'll get the first shot at seeing sale plants, and you'll have an opportunity to meet lots of other members.

4. Lastly, **attend** the show. And bring friends!! You'll be amazed by the beauty of what you and your friends here in the society have grown; maybe they'll even join the society themselves. In any case, they (and you) will probably leave the show with a plant or two, and you'll have turned someone else on to orchids!

Messages from the President

Do you usually come to the meeting and stay the whole time? Do you enjoy meeting new people? The society needs **two people to help out with Raffle Ticket Sales**. You should stay until the end at every meeting, and be able count out tickets and money (yes, you get to hold lots of money!!).

How I control Aphids: Aphids are upon us due to the unusually warm weather. I find Cymbidiums buds are favorite targets for these insects. I spray the buds with Spectacide Houseplant and Garden Insect Spray (available from Home Depot or Orchard Supply), wait approximately 1-2 minutes, then thoroughly rinse the buds and leaves with water. I have experienced bud or new growth damage (or death) by leaving the spray in contact with either plant part for a length of time.

Recent Events

As the Show Season continues, some wonderful events have occurred over the past month! The Santa Cruz show was beautifully done and clearly very well planned for optimal sales contributions to the club. They have four categories (rather than our 3): beginner, intermediate, advanced, and commercial. Consequently, commercial growers sell plants at the show and the society takes a cut. This seems like a great idea for shows. The selection of show plants was pretty good as well, with three plants awarded at AOS judging, two of which went to our member **Kreg Martin**, and one of which went to judge and Malihini auctioneer **Dennis Olivas**. The Pacific Orchid Expo was a tremendously beautiful event, with a wealth of interesting species and novel hybrids to appreciate, learn about and purchase. This show, the third largest in the US, is probably the premier show in the world focusing on Pleurothallids; at this event, three beautiful Wardian cases were set up to showcase numerous rare miniature species. In addition to the display, the vendor's area was quite well-stocked with everything from Taiwanese mericlones of awarded Cattleyas, Cymbidium, and Phals to species from Columbia and Panama, to **Andy's Orchids** perennial favorite hanging garden of "orchids on sticks." Eleven AOS awards went out to the exhibitors, including an FCC to **John Leather's** Dracula Raven (see pictures in the next issue). Also of note was **Angelic Nguyen's** Cymbidium, which captured Best in Show. Please congratulate her on this amazing honor! Since so many awards need to be processed by the AOS pertaining to this show, pictures of awarded plants for the Pacific Orchid Expo will be included in next month's newsletter. A number of plants received high awards, and many of the unusual species, so be sure to be on the lookout for those next month.

As we get into March, there will be a wealth of shows to attend; you can find out more information about them by referring to the "Upcoming Events" section below. The Santa Barbara Orchid Fair, and the Malihini society show are highlights on the list. Try to make it to as many shows as possible to support our fellow AOS-affiliated societies, and make a **special note of the SCVOS Show, coming up in late March**.

Show Schedule



The show is open to any and all exhibitors, except commercial growers¹. The show committee encourages all growers to enter as many plants as possible to make this show an outstanding success. The Santa Clara Valley Orchid Society assumes no responsibility for damage to or loss of plants entered in the show. Entries for individual plant judging, including American Orchid Society (A.O.S.) Award Judging, must be presented to the entry clerk in the mall between 3:00 PM and 7PM on March 31st. Any entry presented after 7:00 PM will not be accepted. Judging will be at 9:00 AM on Saturday, April 1st. All plants must be removed at 5:00 PM Sunday, April 2nd. Commercial orchid growers are not eligible for ribbons or trophy judging¹.

Plants submitted for A.O.S. judging only shall be on display for the length of the show, and may be removed on Sunday, April 2nd at 5:00 PM.

At the discretion of the judges, First, Second, and Third place ribbons will be awarded in all classes in all sections. Only plants which are correctly labeled and completely entered for ribbon judging will be considered. Any plant infested with insects, or diseased, will be removed from the show.

No plant may be entered for ribbon or trophy judging unless it has been owned and grown by the exhibitor for six months. Plants entered for A.O.S. judging are governed by the A.O.S. rules.

The S.C.V.O.S Show is an A.O.S.-sanctioned show. The A.O.S. rules state: "All plants or flowers submitted at a regional judging session or exhibited at an A.O.S.-sanctioned show shall be considered for an award and the exhibitor is obligated to accept and pay the fee for any (A.O.S) award granted except where he has clearly indicated before the judging that his entry is not to be A.O.S. judged. An exhibitor may not specify what award he will accept." Any photographer's fees will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.

Meristem and stem propagated plants are not considered seedlings.

¹ A commercial grower is one who derives a substantial part of one's income from the sale of orchids.

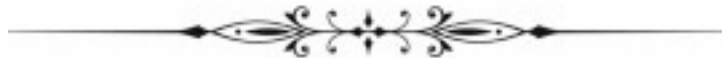

Judging Divisions

Individual plants will be judged under the listed sections and classes in three categories, one category per household including off site growing areas.

AMATEUR: One who has won less than 4 trophies other than ribbons, at any orchid show.

INTERMEDIATE: One who has won at least 4, but less than 15 trophies, other than ribbons, at orchid shows and is not a commercial grower.

ADVANCED: One who has won 15 or more trophies, other than ribbons, at orchid shows, and is not a commercial grower as defined above

Note: In Classes A-9, B-8, C-8, E-10, and F-10, plants may be entered in 2 classes: seedlings blooming for the first time, and the appropriate color class, in the appropriate divisions

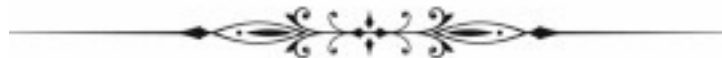

Job Descriptions



Entry: Clerks

Check that entry cards are properly completed. **Locate** correct classification in show schedule for each plant. **Copy** plant titles from entry slip into show spreadsheet. Use MS Excel quickly and efficiently.

Entry: Examiner

Verify classification of plants entered before entry clerk enters plant in spreadsheet. **Reclassify** plants as necessary. **Assist** exhibitors in finding proper classification.

Plant Sales: Cashier

Stay near cash box and plant sales tables. **Collect** money, make change. **Place stickers** on plants which have been purchased. **Box** plants which have been purchased. **Collect** member sales receipts.

Plant Sales: Advanced Grower Answer

questions and **advise** regarding orchids. You are the **advanced grower** of the hour. People with questions they cannot answer about orchid growing will be directed to you for answers.

Plant Sales: Salesperson

Be aware of the sales inventory. **Help** customers find the plants they want. **Answer** customer questions about orchids. **Invoice** the customers by writing up a sales tag for plants they wish to purchase.

Host or Hostess

Watch plants and guests to see that no plants are taken. **Answer** questions. One person **stands or sits** by the door.

Potting Demonstrators

Bring your own plants, tools, and potting materials. **Demonstrate** appropriate potting technique. **Answer** questions.

Ribbon Clerk

Accompany judges with the judging spreadsheet. **Record** awards. **Place** ribbons.

Set Up

Appear at 9:30 am Thursday at show site ready to work. **Wear** work clothes. **Set up** tables and stands for plant display. **Clean** and **label** plants for sale. **Run** errands.

Take Down

Appear at 5:00 pm on Sunday at show site ready to work. **Wear** work clothes. **Take down** tables and stands and sale plants. **Run** errands.

Exhibitors:

- Bring plants after 3:00 pm Friday.
- Complete entry cards **legibly**
- Remove plants by 5:00 pm Sunday.

Member Sales:

- Bring plants by 9:00 pm Thursday.
- Complete sales information prior to bringing in your plants.

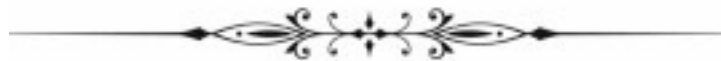
Sales Rules and General Information



To ensure that our show runs as smoothly as possible, the board has set into place the following rules concerning the sale of member plants:

1. Members may bring a maximum of 50 plants for the sale and requests to exceed 50 plants shall be approved by the Show Chair.
2. Member sales plants shall be priced at whole dollar amounts with the plant owner receiving 75% of the displayed prices. Sales tax shall be added to the displayed value for purchaser's payments.
3. Member shall provide a master list of plants checked-in for sale. It is advisable to have a second copy for record-keeping at the discretion of the member.
4. Member shall provide a detachable label with the owner ID and sale price on each plant. Label blanks may be found below and will be provided at the monthly meetings for the two months prior to the show.
5. Unsold member plants may be checked out and removed only after closing on the final day.
6. Member's checks shall be based on the removable tags' accumulated sale price, and lost tags are not the responsibility of the SCVOS. Each member selling plants assumes risk of such tags, and unless the member can indisputably verify the sale occurred, there will be no reimbursement to the member.
7. Above rules shall be accepted upon submitting plants for sale and plant ID list.
